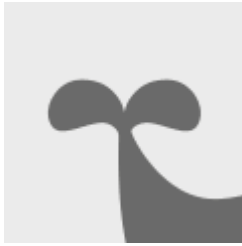

Author: Gustav Schwab (1792 - 1850) was a priest, secondary school teacher and writer. With "Myths and Epics of Ancient Greece", which he made publicly available in 1838, he created a classic in German children's and YA literature.

After stopovers in Tübingen, Leipzig and Chemnitz, he came to Bamberg where he has held a chair for ancient history since 2002. Guest professorships brought him to England (Exeter) and the US (Providence and Princeton). He is the author of a number of books and is also present in public media.
